Tournament Day Schedule

REGISTRATION: 11:00am to 12:30pm. Range Balls available at the driving range. Golfers are greeted and link golf bags to carts.

PUTTING CONTEST: 12:30pm. Putting contest on the *practice* putting green.

OPENING CEREMONY: 12:40pm Chairman Remarks; ROTC Color Guard.

PGA GOLF PRO TIPS: 12:45pm.

TEE-OFF: 1:00pm. Lead-out to holes (shotgun start). Turn-in carts and scorecards upon completion of the course.

AWARDS DINNER/BANQUET: 5:30pm. Upstairs in the Clubhouse for the dinner buffet, auction (items on display in the banquet room), and awards program immediately following dinner.

Which tee-box do I use? Harbor Hills has 7 sets of tee-boxes.

NOTE: Players not fitting into any of the above categories play the GOLD tees at 6700 yards.				

What is a "step-aside" scramble? Everyone drives as usual. Pick the drive your team wants to play and hit away – except for the person who drove the ball doesn't get to hit. Do the same for all shots until the ball is on the green. All players may attempt any putt. Repeat for 17 holes.

What about mulligans? Each player may purchase up to two mulligans (\$5.00 each at registration). For convenience, a player may purchase additional mulligans for his/her team, but no team may USE more than eight mulligans.

"Strings" Golfers may purchase one (1) String for use during play to move the ball the length of the string. The String may be used only once. Golfers may either purchase a 3 foot String for \$5.00 or a 5 foot String for \$10.00. Only one String per golfer. The String can NOT be used in "closest to the pin" contest. Use of the String does not count as a stroke.

Long-Ball Hitter Golfers may pay a pro to hit their drive on one hole.
